

WHAT WE BELIEVE

A Traditional Anglican Church affirms its 'Catholic' heritage. That term is used to affirm our fidelity to the whole Faith as revealed by Jesus Christ (without either additions or subtractions) as proclaimed by the Apostles, evangelists, saints, scholars and martyrs of the Early Church and taught in Holy Scripture. At the same time, we give thanks for the witness of those pastors and teachers, who in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries sought to "reform" the Church, some of whom gave their lives in witness to the authority of the Bible as the principle rule of Faith and Practice.

Anglican faith is thoroughly grounded in Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as the authentic record of God's revelation of himself, his saving activity, and moral demands.

We hold that the ancient creeds - the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian - express the faith of the Church and are to be understood as they are written.

We do nothing new, but rather, continue in the Christian Faith as received by the Church of England and passed on to us by our faithful predecessors; holding firmly to the truth and order of the Holy Scriptures, the Creeds, Sacraments, and the Apostolic Ministry.

Our official and only Liturgy is The Book of Common Prayer (1962).

We are determined by the help of God to hold and maintain the Doctrine, Sacraments, and Discipline of Christ as the Lord hath commanded in His Holy Writ...and to transmit the same, unimpaired, to our posterity.

We hold fast to the principles outlined in the Solemn Declaration 1893 attested to by the Bishops of the Church at its formation in Canada.
