As we continue through our northern summer, one thing we share with our brothers and sisters in warmer climes is that day when school reopens and the new school year starts.

I pray that all of us might appreciate and try to emulate the generosity of a few Australians, who have provided Anglican Aid Abroad with funds to start new schools in Mosho and Birindwa in the Congo.

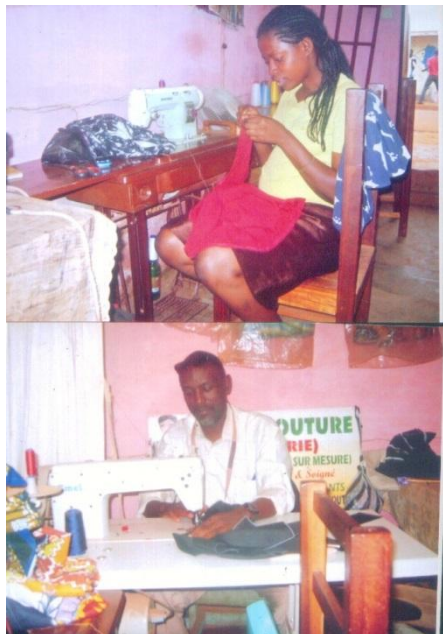
As mentioned in previous newsletters, Bishop Steven has an agreement with the federal government that involves the development and operation of 25 primary and secondary schools, under Ministerial authority and seal. The Bishop now advises that a further 11 schools have been assigned by the federal Ministry of Primary, Secondary and Professional Education.

Also in the Congo, the Africa Appeal has been able to send two young women, Faraja and Wivine, to sewing school and provide them with sewing machines so that they can earn a living for themselves and their children – these are new Singer treadle machines that can be used even when electricity is not available. A second donor has

provided funding toward the establishment of a sewing school in Bukavu.



The potential to turn lives around that comes from training people in a skill such as dress-making is well understood in Cameroon, where two years ago the Ste. Marguerite d'Alacoque sewing school was started with two machines. Now, not only does the school provide training in a marketable skill, it also has proven to be a profit centre, rather than a cost! The same can be said about the information technology school run by Fr. Alphonse and his church for the past few years, even though there is only dial up networking available which causes delays and difficulties with large files. Even sending the photos shown below was difficult due to sporadic and poor internet connection in Cameroon.



As we look ahead to the new school year, here are some more photographs of the last year in Yaounde:

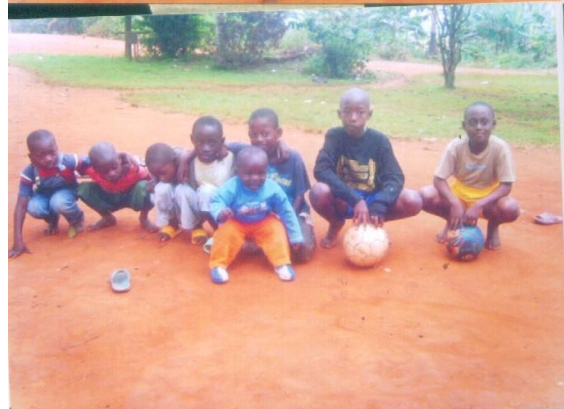


At left, the IT school, and below, children from St. Augustine's school, Yaounde, Cameroon.
